

# 49th COLLEGE DAY REPORT

### MARCH 22, 2024 (FRIDAY)



Esteemed Chief Guest of the day, Dr B. Ahilan, Dean and Guest of Honor, Dr. N. V. Sujathkumar, Professor & Head, Fisheries College & Research Institute, Mother Superior, Rev. Sr. Siron, Headmistress of HCHS School, Rev. Sr. Sarath Mary, dear sisters, learned members of the faculty, administrative staff, members of PTA, Alumni, well-wishers and my dear students, Good morning.

I extend a warm welcome to all of you on the occasion of the 49th College Day of Holy Cross Home Science College Thoothukudi.

At the outset, it is my pleasure to introduce our distinguished guest, Dr. B. Ahilan. Dr. Ahilan currently holds the position of Dean at the Fisheries College and Research Institute, affiliated with the Tamil Nadu Dr. Jayalalitha Fisheries University in Thoothukudi. With an impressive tenure of 32 years at the university, Dr. Ahilan has showcased extensive expertise in teaching, research, extension, and administration. As a Professor of Aquaculture, he notably held the position of Dean at Dr. MGR FC&RI, Ponneri from 2017 to 2022. His academic prowess extends to leading over 30 research projects, generously funded by various Central and State government organizations, focusing on ornamental fish culture, fish nutrition and the training of fish farmers. Notably, he spearheaded the establishment of the Nutrition Laboratory and Feed Mill Unit at FC& RI, Thoothukudi, in 2015, utilizing NADP funds. Additionally, he set up RAS units for seabass and an Aquaponics unit at AFFF, TNJFU, Madhavaram, Chennai, in 2018, further enhancing research infrastructure. Dr. Ahilan's scholarly contributions are extensive, encompassing 16 textbooks, 113 research articles in reputable journals and 92 papers presented at international/national conferences and seminars. Dr. Ahilan's dedication to fisheries education earned him the "Best Teacher Award" from the Professional Fisheries Graduate Forum (PFGF) in Mumbai in 2003 and from TANUVAS in Chennai in 2011. He currently serves as the Faculty Dean for Fisheries Science and Dean (Academics) for TNJFU, implementing notable academic reforms and demonstrating his commitment to advancing fisheries education. Welcome sir.

It is with immense pleasure that I introduce our esteemed guest of honor, Dr. N.V. Sujathkumar. Currently, Dr. Sujathkumar holds the esteemed position of Professor and Head of the Department of Fisheries Extension, Economics, and Statistics at the Fisheries College and Research Institute in Thoothukudi. With an impressive 35-year tenure, Dr. Sujathkumar has amassed extensive experience in teaching, research, extension work, and administration.

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He has also served as the Dean in charge of the college for one year. Throughout his career, Dr. Sujathkumar has made significant contributions to education and research. He has mentored 20 postgraduate students at both the M.F.Sc and Ph.D. levels, serving as Chairman or Member of the Student Advisory Committee. Additionally, he has expanded his expertise internationally, visiting countries such as the United Kingdom and the USA to participate in the development of audiovisual aids and e-learning courses for the B.FSc degree programme in India. In terms of research, Dr. Sujathkumar has led over 10 projects funded by various Central and State government organizations and published more than 35 research articles. These projects have covered a wide range of topics including fisheries extension, marine ornamental fish breeding and e-learning programmes. His efforts have not only contributed to the academic community but have also resulted in tangible infrastructure developments such as the establishment of the TRYSEM – AV Hall, Video Studio and e-learning laboratory. Welcome, Sir.

As we pause to contemplate the remarkable 49-year journey of our college, our hearts brim with gratitude towards the divine. Our institution offers a range of educational opportunities including 6 undergraduate (U.G) and 3 postgraduate (P.G) courses, along with a research program in Commerce. Additionally, we provide Tailoring courses, including Aari Work and Beautician, reinforced by both State and Central governments. We take pride in our diverse curriculum, which aims to cater to the educational needs of our students while also offering skill development opportunities aligned with government initiatives.

The activities of the academic year 2023-24 started with the reopening of the college on June 19, 2023, the day commenced with a Holy Spirit Mass, seeking divine blessings for all members and endeavours for the senior students and 21<sup>st</sup> June for the I UG & I PG students. Orientation to the freshers along with their parents is a regular feature of our college.

#### **OUR STRENGTH**

Currently, our college boasts a student body of 573 students, supported by a band of 43 dedicated and efficient teaching faculty and 6 administrative staff. Thirty-seven teaching staff are Ph.D. holders; 6 are doing part-time research. #### STUDENTS PARTICIPATION

Students are encouraged to participate in seminars/conferences/workshops. 56 students have attended seminars organized by the university and other colleges and 107 in the parent

institution itself. FSSAI organized student competitions, including quizzes, poster-making and millet recipe preparation. Winners received certificates and shields, with a paper and poster contest focusing on home food safety. Additionally, the Department of Food Science and Nutrition conducted a poster-making competition on the "International Year of Millets 2023," with twenty students participating. 22 students from the PG & Research Department of Commerce attended a Skill Training Programme in Honey Bee Horticultural, Muthaloor, Sathankulam on 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2023.

#### **INTERNSHIPS & INDUSTRIAL VISITS**

The PG Departments of Food Science and Nutrition, along with the Research Department of Commerce, coordinated Clinical Dietetics internship programs in Coimbatore, Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli for both undergraduate and postgraduate students. These programs aimed to offer students practical exposure and hands-on experience in real-world settings. Additionally, nine departments organized industrial visits to various companies, including Idhayam, V.V.V. Sons, Edible Oils Limited, Spectra Lab, Nila Seafoods Cold Storage Private Limited, Anjali Oil Mill, SNP Milk Plant, Connemara Tea Factory, Vandiperiyar, SPIC Ornamental Garden, Defense Food Research Laboratory in Mysuru, Penguin Apparels, Aralvaimozhiand fabric industries in Puthamputhur. These visits were intended to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application, thereby preparing students for their future professional endeavours.

#### **DAY CELEBRATIONS**

Throughout the academic year, our college organized numerous events to promote student leadership, community engagement and academic enrichment. The Students Administration Day, orchestrated by the Students Union Council, empowered students with administrative responsibilities and facilitated senior students in teaching roles for juniors, nurturing leadership skills and fostering community involvement. Various celebrations, including Teachers Day, Holy Cross Feast, Deepavali, Christmas and Pongal, fostered joyous get-togethers, while commemorations of International Yoga Day and International Self Care Day enriched students' holistic well-being. Additionally, the Department of Psychology

organized awareness programs on Suicide Prevention and World Suicide Prevention Day, emphasizing "Creating Hope through Action." Other initiatives like the Expo, special lectures and contests by the Department of Food Science and Nutrition promoted health awareness, including programs on millets, nutrition education, World Food Day, World Breastfeeding Week and National Nutrition Week. Events such as the Nutri-flashmob and Cancer Awareness Programme furthered health education, while the Department of Computer Science observed Ozone Day and conducted an e-waste campaign contributing to sustainability efforts.

The PG & Research Department of Commerce celebrated Commerce Day with the intra-departmental competition "DIA DEL COMMERCIO'23" and organized a guest lecture on Human Resource Professional Day to enhance students' understanding of HR practices. Initiatives by the Department of Tamil, such as Illakkiyam Kaatum Penn Nilaippadu and Vaanavil K.Raviyin Padaippugal, alongside celebrations of Kamarajar Birthday, World Literacy Day and Vanna Vizha, highlight the preservation and promotion of the cultural heritage of Tamil-speaking people. Additionally, these endeavours serve as a platform for the expression of classical literature, poetry and religious texts.

#### **EXTENSION ACTIVITIES**

All the departments conducted 22 extension activities to a rehabilitation centre, Caldwell Colony, Thoothukudi and skill training for school children in R.C Primary School, Threspuram, Sivandhi Aditnar School, Extension Middle School, Panchayat Union Middle School, Shanmugapuram, Thoothukudi, Seenaa Vaanaa Govt. Hr. Sec. School, TNDTA Middle School, Keela Shunmugapuram Thoothukudi visited for extension activities. Our students adapted fun-based activities to teach English grammar and spoken English to the middle school level students.

#### LIFE SKILLS PROGRAMME

The Postgraduate Department of English conducted a 2-day Life Skills Programme titled "FemPower Navigating Tomorrow" for all the final undergraduate and postgraduate students of our college on 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> February 2024.

#### **CERTIFICATE COURSES**

In both odd and even semesters, sixteen and twelve certificate courses respectively are offered, aiming to provide learners with real-world exposure and practical application of their skills.

#### ACCOLADES

The academic year 2023-24 was marked by several notable achievements and events. G Rea Keren won the Gold Medal in the District Level Badminton Tournament held at Thoothukudi on the 21st & 22nd February 2024. Inter-collegiate tournaments in Chess, Badminton and Hockey were also attended, showcasing the college's sporting prowess. G. Rea Keren represented the college in the South Zone inter-University Badminton Tournament and emerged victorious in district-level Badminton Competitions held in March 2024. Additionally, college hockey players were chosen to represent the state in championship competitions. In July 2023, college athletes showcased outstanding performances in the statelevel Chief Minister's Trophy, with Ms. G. Rea Keren representing Thoothukudi district in Badminton, alongside students participating in Football and Hockey tournaments, highlighting the college's dedication to both academics and sports, furthermore, Ms. M. Archana of I B.Sc. CS secured the Runner position in a Hockey match at Rani Anna Govt. Women's College, Tirunelveli. Our students won I, II & III prizes in Kavithai competition at Kamaraj College, Thoothukudi, Extempore conducted by JCI, Tamil Nadu State NSS Cell (State Adventure Camp-2023 at Yercaud), NSS National Adventure Camp at Dharamshala, Himachal Pradesh, District Level Badminton Tournament at Thoothukudi, Group Dance competition at The American College, Madurai, District Level Shuttle – Singles, District Level Shuttle – Doubles, Standup Comedy competition-Commquest organized by Kamaraj College, Thoothukudi, JCI Pearl city Full Novel quiz in Tamil. Ms. A.M. Mahmoodha Safrun, Graduate of M.Sc (DFM) cleared NET examination in December 2023. Dr.N.N.Krishnaveni, Scientist Fellowship Program, IPR under Women Scientist Fellowship Program (Selected), DST, Govt of India from January 23, 2023-2024.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The Central Sector Scheme of Scholarship for College & University Students received 107 applications, out of which 51 were approved, totalling an amount of ₹6,88,000 disbursed

so far. Post Matric Scholarship for Students with Disabilities amounts to ₹14,000. There were 30 applicants for the Post Matric Scholarship for Adi-Dravidar. The management and well-wishers offer fee concessions and freeships to deserving students based on merit and financial need.

A food bank is offering free meals (Lunch) to 25 underprivileged students experiencing financial difficulties. Books, educational materials and other stationery items are usually provided at the start of the academic year. However, due to severe flooding, additional essentials such as sarees, dhotis, lungis, pants, shirts, towels, bed sheets and food items like rice, lentils, sugar, oil, wheat flour and semolina in bags are being distributed to flood victims. Additionally, stationery and books are being provided after the flood because students residing in low-lying areas lost their possessions.

#### LIBRARY

Our library boasts a collection of 6707 books and subscribes to 23 journals and periodicals with open access. This year, 77 books were added to our collection, totalling an expenditure of Rs. 51,110 on books and journals for the academic year 2023-24. Additionally, the library is connected to the Inflib-Nlist facility. The Crossian Book Bazaar Expo took place on September 27, 2023.

#### SPORTS

The Sports Committee organized a Sports Day celebration, where college students actively participated in various sports events such as 100 m, 200 m, relay, Badminton, Football, Hockey, Chess and Carom. The chief guest Mr. Rajesh graced the day celebration and distributed prizes to the winners.

#### NSS

The NSS unit at Holy Cross Home Science College initiated impactful events and initiatives, starting with a rally against drug abuse on June 26, 2023, involving Dr. Jayanthasri Balakrishnan and 83 volunteers. Collaborating with the Health & Fitness committee and YRC units, an eye checkup camp on July 11-12, 2023, identified eyesight issues in 189 out of 548 students examined. Regular extension activities in Pandarampatti village included awareness

programs for villagers. A NSS orientation program on July 13, 2023, hosted 75 students with Dr. A. Vasanthi from Pope's College, Sawyerpuram, as the guest speaker. Marking NSS Unit 53's anniversary on August 15, 2023, the college planted 23 saplings in the adopted village with 25 volunteers. Other activities included addressing cybercrime against women, treks, marathons, coastal area beach cleaning and seed collection efforts. Notable achievements included recognition for planting 1000 palm seeds on October 12, 2023 and participation in adventure camps. Additionally, a special NSS camp from January 26 to February 1, 2024, was held in Pandarampatti, Thoothukudi district. The unit also organized a blood donation camp with Thoothukudi Government Hospital on March 20, 2024, highlighting its commitment to community welfare.

#### YRC

The YRC inaugurated its academic year 2023-24 with a ceremony on September 21, 2023, led by Dr. Vasikaran, Chairman of the Indian Red Cross in Thoothukudi District. An awareness program titled "Health and Hygiene" took place at St. Antony's High School, Siluvaipatti, on February 20, 2024.

#### PTA AND ALUMNI

The college values the significant support provided by the PTA and Alumni, whose participation in General Body Meetings is highly valued. On October 29, 2023, an alumni meeting was held, honoured by the presence of retired Tamil staff member, Mrs. Saroja Jone. The event showcased cultural performances by students and was attended by around 128 alumni.

#### **CELLS/CLUBS/COMMITTEES**

Subsequently, all associations, clubs and committees were inaugurated, along with the installation of student council members. The college witnessed numerous impactful events and initiatives across various domains. The Fine Arts Week "Crossian Femme Fiesta" held on August 24 & 25, 2023, showcased students' talents and the PG Department of Food Science & Nutrition winning the rolling shield. The 77th Flag Hoisting Ceremony on August 15, 2023, featured Mr. N. Keerthi Nivas as the chief guest. Additionally, during the NSS valedictory

function on January 30, 2024, students performed folk dances to raise awareness about antidrug abuse.

The Eco and Rotaract Clubs were actively engaged in environmental initiatives, including a wall painting program named "Save the Children" on July 1, 2023 and collaboration with the Thoothukudi Municipal Corporation for awareness programs. They also participated in planting 10,000 palm tree seeds on October 18, 2023 and contributed to a plantation drive at the college campus on February 28, 2024, for National Science Day.

The Consumer Club and Human Rights Cell collaborated to organize a rally and awareness program on individual rights and social injustice on February 2, 2024, inaugurated by Mr. Prabaharan, the Tahsildar of Tuticorin Taluk, alongside senior police officials.

The college's Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Drug Committee organized events such as guest lectures and surprise bus stand visits to prevent ragging. They also conducted visits to rehabilitation centres, reflecting the college's commitment to student safety and respect.

The Career Guidance Cell organized sessions on personal hygiene, personality development, bank job opportunities, and TANCET MCA Exam Preparation, benefiting students with insights from industry experts and alumni.

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDII) involved students in entrepreneurial activities such as honey cultivation and vermicompost training since January 12, 2023. Collaborations with external partners enhanced student readiness for the entrepreneurial landscape.

The Young Innovator Contest' 23 cum Expo aimed to foster innovation among youth, with schools and college students participating in showcasing prototypes and ideas. The club also organized a cyber security awareness programme for hostel students on September 12, 2023, focusing on protecting data from hackers and safe mobile phone handling.

#### UBA

The UBA Coordinator, Dr. N.N. Krishnaveni, participated in workshops focusing on community outreach activities. She engaged in one-to-one meetings with village Panchayat

leaders to discuss low-cost/no-cost activities and gather village profile data. The team received UBA funds amounting to Rs. 50,000 on January 28, 2024.

#### HOSTEL

There are students in the hostel who are cared guided and animated by Deputy Warden Sr. Sylvia. Renewal programmes, input sessions, group sessions and para-liturgical services on special occasions are arranged for the inmates.

- Constructing the Golden Jubilee Block to commemorate our institution's milestone.
- Establishing a Research Centre for Food Science & Nutrition
- Renovation of Nutrition and biochemistry labs
- Extension of Food Court/ canteen
- Initiating the process of re-accreditation by NAAC to uphold our commitment to quality education and continuous improvement.

Special thanks to colleagues, both teaching and non-teaching staff, for their continuous collaboration. Our students are appreciated and we wish ongoing success in serving the nation.
