

### ONLINE WEBINAR ON RESEARCH METRICS


#### 27<sup>th</sup> FEBRUARY 2023


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## SKILL TRAINING PROGRAMME ON METRIC PATTERN CUTTING



Since the mid-nineteenth century, when the sewing machine was created, clothing has been produced essentially in the same way. Because they cannot afford technological small advancements, some producers and designers of custom clothing continue to use antiquated, labor-intensive techniques. There will likely be a rise in the need for

fabric and apparel patternmakers, creating 740 new positions by 2029. Young people with a



The majority of fashion students will not start out at this advanced level. Additionally, not all fashion designers will be obliged to manufacturing meet specifications. However, in reality, while working with a pattern maker, fashion students and designers ought to be able to comprehend

them and create a thorough line drawing of a garment. Some of the most successful fashion illustrators have little to no design expertise, so they avoid getting involved in the intricate details of pattern cutting or garment production.
