

GUEST LECTURE ON YOUTH STANDING UP FOR HUMAN RIGHTS

Every year on December 10th, Human Rights Day commemorates the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) in 1948. (UDHR). The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) is a text that "proclaims the inalienable rights that every human being is entitled to" - regardless of gender, language, religion, race, colour, national or socioeconomic origin, political or other opinions, or other classifications. The Universal Declaration of Human Rights is available in over 500 languages and is the most widely translated text on the planet. It remains the cornerstone of all international human rights legislation.

In view of celebrating Human Rights Day, a guest lecture on “Youth Standing Up for Human Rights” was organised on 09th December, 2021 for the students by the IQAC.
