Anti-Ragging Committee Report

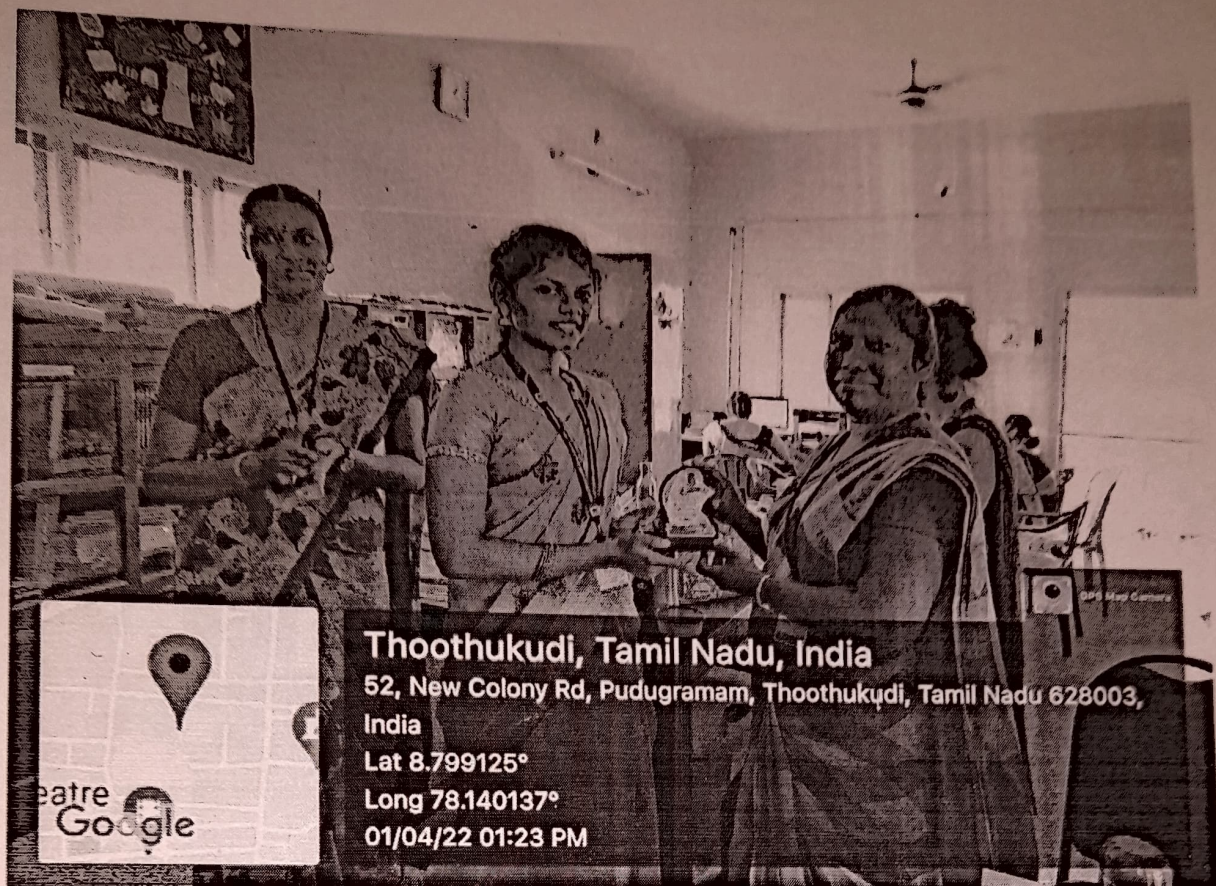
